We have analyzed the proteins of eggs, milk, starch and water.






My favorite activity among those that we did at school was the microscopic view of the structure of some common ingredients.

In my host family there are four people: Eliska, her brother and her parents. From the first moment her parents were very kind with me, they did their best to make me feel at ease and I felt as I was at home. As for the food I noticed some differences, one of these is that the Czechs compared to the Italians eat less carbohydrates. A typical sweet of the Czech cuisine is the trdelník, also called trdlo. The dough is



a kind of sweet bread that is sprinkled with sugar and cinnamon and I totally felt in love with this sweet.

In the Czech Republic there is the tradition of not using the same shoes used outside. Another typical Czech tradition is at Easter and it is Pomlázka, which sees the boys whipping girls as a desire for young people who receive colored eggs, sweets and alcohol from adults.

On this trip I also discovered that students who have to sit their school-leaving exams, on their last schoolday dress up and go around the city, writing on the faces of the people, asking them for

some money!





In that week we visited an open-air museum...
