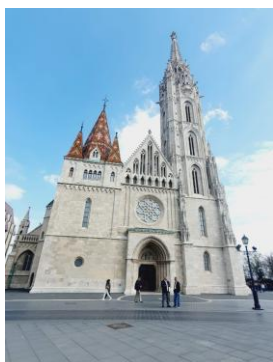

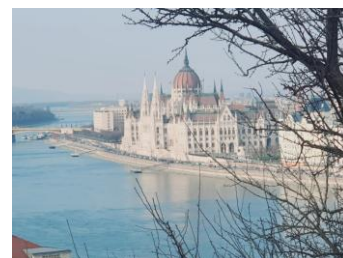
Every day while in Nyiregyhaza the students produced creative artwork which reflected the style of Impressionism. The productions were unique, and each participant showed interest and gratification for their design.
